Prizes:

1. The 'Marden Trophy' for the exhibitor with the most points overall
2. The 'Irene Dance Vase' for the best vase of Garden Flowers (class 24)
3. A Garden Voucher for the highest number of points in Section A (classes 1-12)
4. A Garden Voucher for the highest number of points in Section B (classes 13-29)
6. A Garden Voucher for the highest number of points in Section C (classes 30-50)
7. A Garden Voucher for the Best Geranium - Class 13

Dahlia Sizes refer to the diameter of the bloom

As per the RHS Show handbook 2016.

Only the size of the pompon changed from 50mm (2") to 55mm (2¼") in 2016

Pompon not to exceed 55 mm (2¼")

Miniature Ball between 50mm & 100mm (2" & 4")

Small Ball between 100mm & 150mm (4" & 6")

Miniature flower not to exceed 100mm (4")

Small-flower between 100mm & 150mm (4" & 6")

Medium-flower between 150mm & 200mm (6" & 8")

Large-flower between 200mm & 250mm (8" & 10")

Points system:- First=4pts; Second=3pts; Third=2pts

Section A - Dahlias

Class

1. Vase of 1 bloom - **Cactus or Semi-cactus** - any size
2. Vase of 3 blooms - **Cactus or Semi-cactus** - miniature or small
3. Vase of 3 blooms - **Cactus or Semi-cactus** - medium or large
4. Vase of 1 bloom - **Decorative** - any size
5. Vase of 3 blooms - **Decorative** - miniature or small
6. Vase of 3 blooms - **Decorative** - medium or large
7. Vase of 3 blooms - **Ball** - miniature or small
8. Vase of 3 blooms - **Pompon** (New size not to exceed 55mm)
9. Vase of 3 blooms - **Collerette**
10. Vase of 3 blooms - **Waterlily**
11. Vase of 3 blooms - **any other variety**
12. Vase of 5 blooms - **all different (colours/varieties)**

Section B - Flowers

Classes 24 to 29 will be viewed from any angle

13. **Special Geranium Class**

This is the Geranium grown-on from the plug supplied by LHS in the spring. Inside rim of pot max size 8” (20.5mm)

14. **Asters** (Annuals) vase of 3 stems
15. **Asters** (Michaelmas daisy), vase of 3 stems
16. **Cosmos** – 3 stems
18. **Chrysanthemums** – vase of 3 stems
19. **Gladiolus** – 1 stem
20. **Rose** – 1 bloom (*foliage optional*)
21. **Rudbeckias** – Vase of 5 stems
22. **Sunflower** – 1 stem – single or multi headed
23. **Vase of 3 stems** of any other flower not listed in this schedule
24. **Vase of Garden Flowers** (*excluding shrubs but may include roses*)
25. **Vase of Autumn Shrubs and Berries**
26. **Flowering pot plant** (*excl. orchid*) – max inside rim of pot 8” (20cm)
27. **Foliage pot plant** –max inside rim of pot 8” (20cm)
28. **Fuchsia**, bush in a pot – max inside rim of pot 6” (15cm)
29. **Orchid Plant** – max inside rim of pot 8” (20cm)

Section 'C' – Fruit & Vegetables

30. **Blueberries** - dish of 12 with stalks
31. **Fruit**, soft - dish of 12 with stalks
32. **Fruit**, top fruit with stalks - a dish of 3 (stalk side down)
33. **Beans – French** - dish of 6
34. **Beans - Runner** - dish of 6
35. **Carrots** – dish of 3 – long pointed (*tops trimmed not tied*)
36. **Carrots** – dish of 3 – stump rooted (*tops trimmed not tied*)
37. **Courgettes** - dish of 2
38. **Leeks** - dish of 3
39. **Onions** – each bulb over 250gm, a dish of **3** (*tops tied with raffia*)
40. **Onions** – each bulb under 250gm, a dish of **3** (*tops tied with raffia*)
41. **Parsnips** - dish of 3
42. **Peppers**, hot (chilli) – dish of 6 (*any variety*)
43. **Peppers**, sweet – dish of 2 (*any variety*)
44. **Shallots** – exhibition, dish of **6** (*tops tied with raffia for class 45 & 46*)
45. **Shallots** – pickling, dish of **6** must not exceed 30mm in diam, (*see above*)
46. **Squash**, autumn type (butternut etc) - dish of 1
47. **Sweetcorn** - dish of 2 (*leave husks on*)
48. **Tomatoes** – medium, dish of 4 (approx 60mm diam)
49. **Pumpkin – The Heaviest Pumpkin**

50. **A vase of 6 flowers and 2 dishes of different vegetables.**

Each dish to have 2 vegetables of the same variety.

A “dish” is a collection of vegetables and not a container; vegetables may be displayed on the table top.

51. **A Display of Home grown Vegetables,**

(*may include salad and herbs*) arranged in a basket, trug or box not exceeding 18” (46cms) in length.

52. **Collection of 4 kinds of Vegetables, 1 dish of each**

Max size of box 24” x 24” (60cms x 60cms)

Select from cabbage & cauliflower (2 of each); peas (6), beans (6), sprouts (6) or shallots (6) or 3 from any other variety not mentioned.

Pointing will be equal for each variety of vegetable (max 20 points each)

NB. For class 52 Vegetables must be displayed within the allotted area.
